During July this summer, the Security Industry Authority (SIA) underwent a change in its system. It was announced that the licensing system was to be directed online. Therefore when applying for a SIA badge or even renewing for a new SIA badge, all of the procedures were to be completed online unlike previously.

Many of our employees were not aware of this situation and had to be told when using the license system that the system has been changed. Mainly the employees

who were renewing the SIA badge were not aware of this situation, as they have previously ringed up to renew the badge or completed a form for a badge.

However, the main problem our employees faced in this new system change, was that whenever they had an enquiry or were unsure of something, they could not ring up on the phone. The procedure was to email through the website all of the enquiries, which took at least five working days, but sometimes even more. This was a major

problem as employees wanted to work as soon as possible by renewing the badge quickly.

The SIA have been made aware of this situation and have replied back by saying that a high number of messages than expected have been sent, therefore it takes time to reply back to every single message. It seems that the SIA have dealt with this situation, as it has announced at the end of September that it has employed more staff members in order to deal with the complains as soon as possible.
